ARY and Joseph appeared before the priest in the temple. Joseph became the true husband of the Virgin Mary. They made their home in Nazareth.



Mary and Joseph are an example of the kind of love husbands and wives should have for each other.




MARY AND JOSEPH GO TO BETHLEHEM







There lived in Jerusalem a pious man named Simeon, and the Holy Spirit was upon him, Who revealed to him that he would not die until he had seen the Messiah. Simeon went to the Temple, inspired by the Holy Spirit. When the parents brought in the Child Jesus to offer Him to God, he took Jesus in his arms and thanked God in these words: "Now, Master, You can take Your servant to Yourself in peace. 




JOSEPH TAKES JESUS AND MARY INTO EGYPT


JOSEPH FINDS THE BOY JESUS IN THE TEMPLE

He worked long hours in his carpenter shop to give Jesus and Mary what they needed. God chose a carpenter to be the foster father of Jesus to show us how much He honored work. Saint Joseph is the patron of workers.

Your whole life should be devoted to Jesus and Mary as Joseph's was. Ask him to help you to love Jesus and Mary as he did. You love Jesus and Mary not only by praying to them often, but also by trying to please them in all that you do as Joseph did. Pray for your father, who works so hard to take care of your family, that Saint Joseph may help him in his work.





OF THE HOLY FAMILY

OD chose Joseph to be the foster father of His Son, the husband of Mary, and the head of the Holy Family because he was a holy man. God gave him all the graces he needed to be a worthy head of the holiest family on earth.

Joseph admired the beautiful example which Jesus and Mary gave him. Like them, he obeyed the will of God in all things. He served Jesus and Mary for the love of God.

The Holy Family found their happiness in loving and serving God faithfully. They often prayed together, and read the writings of the Old Testament. They found their peace and joy in God alone.

The Holy Family is an example of a prayerful family which all Catholic families should imitate. Pray to Jesus, Mary and Joseph for your own family that you may find peace and joy in God alone and serve Him with all the love of your heart as the Holy Family of Nazareth did.

After Joseph's death, Jesus, Who was still a young man, took care of His mother Mary. Jesus worked as a carpenter as His foster father had done.



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
















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
