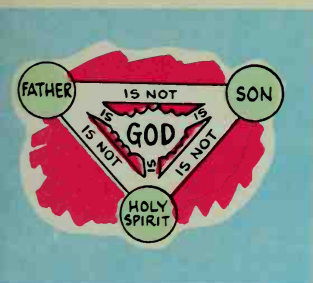


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A

ADVENT

The four weeks before Christmas. **Advent** is a time of prayer in preparation for the birthday of Jesus Christ.



ALLELUIA

A Hebrew word of joy meaning "Praise God!" **Alleluia** is said or sung before the reading of the Gospel at Mass.



ALL SAINTS DAY

A solemn feastday on which we honor all the Saints. **All Saints Day** is celebrated on November 1.



ALTAR

The table in front of the church on which the Sacrifice of the Mass is offered. The **altar** reminds us of Christ and the table of the Last Supper.



AMEN

A word that means "So be it" or "I believe." **Amen** means that we agree with what the speaker says, or believe the prayer we have just said.

ANGEL

A created spirit with no body. Each **angel** is a person with a mind and will.



ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament for the seriously ill, infirm, and aged. The priest gives the **Anointing of the Sick** to ask God to help the sick in body and soul.



APOSTLES

The twelve men that Jesus chose to spread His teaching to the whole world and to whom He gave the power to offer Holy Mass and to forgive sins. The **Apostles** are: Peter, James (the Greater), John, Andrew, Matthew, Philip, Bartholomew, Thomas, James (the Less), Simon, Jude, and Judas who betrayed Jesus and was replaced by Matthias.



"I WILL MAKE YOU FISHERS OF MEN"

APOSTLES' CREED

A short prayer of belief in twelve truths which contain the most important doctrines of the Christian Faith. The **Apostles' Creed** is said to have been given to us by the Apostles.





ASCENSION

The day on which Jesus returned to heaven and was raised in the presence of His Mother and the disciples. The solemn feast of the **Ascension** is celebrated forty days after Easter.



ASH WEDNESDAY

The day when Lent begins. On **Ash Wednesday** we receive ashes to remind us of our death and to show that we should be sorry for our sins.



ASSUMPTION

The day on which the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken to heaven, body and soul, after her death. The feast of the **Assumption** is on August 15.



BAPTISM

B

A new birth as a child of God, the beginning of a new life of God's grace in us. The grace of **Baptism** helps us to become more like Jesus.



BIBLE

The written story of God's actions in the world and the teachings of Jesus, His Son, and of His apostles. The **Bible** is the Word of God.

BISHOPS

They take the place of the Apostles today as shepherds of the Church. The **bishops** are the heads of dioceses that include many parishes.



BLESSED SACRAMENT

The Sacrament in which Christ Himself, true God and true Man, is really present, under the appearances of bread and wine. The **Blessed Sacrament** is Holy Mass, Holy Communion, and the Real Presence of Jesus in the consecrated host and wine.



BLESSED VIRGIN

The Mother of Jesus Christ and the greatest of the Christian Saints. The **Blessed Virgin Mary** is the Mother of God and our Mother.



CANDLE



A sacramental used at Holy Mass and religious devotions. A **candle** is a symbol of faith and of Jesus.



CATHOLIC

A member of the Church founded by Jesus, known as the Roman Catholic Church. **Catholic** means it exists for all races, nations, and classes of people.





CHALICE

The cup used at Mass to contain the Precious Blood of Christ. The **chalice** is usually made of or covered with gold.



CHRIST

The official title given to the Son of God Who became Man to save us. **Christ** means “the Anointed One” or “the Messiah.”



CHRISTMAS

The day on which Christ was born in Bethlehem. We celebrate the feast of **Christmas** on December 25.



CHURCH

The building in which we worship God. **Church** also means the People of God who believe in Jesus Christ and who follow Him.



COMMANDMENT

A law of God or the Church. God gave us the **Ten Commandments** in the Old Testament to guide us on our way through this life by teaching us to love Him and our neighbor.

COMMUNION

A holy meal in which we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus to nourish our soul. In **Communion** we receive Jesus and share in His Divine life.



CONFESSION

The telling of our sins to a priest in the Sacrament of Penance or of Reconciliation. In **confession** we express sorrow for sin and receive God's forgiveness.



CONFIRMATION

In **Confirmation** Jesus sends the Holy Spirit to us again and gives us new strength to live a Christian life. The bishop is the usual minister of the Sacrament of **Confirmation**.



CONSECRATION

That part of the Mass in which bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. At the **Consecration** we think of the Last Supper when Jesus gave us this Sacrament.



CONTRITION

Sorrow for sin because we have offended God Who is so good. We should always try to have true **contrition**.





CREATOR

God is called the **Creator** because He made all things in heaven and earth from nothing. We usually call God the Father, the **Creator**.



CROSS

Two pieces of wood placed over each other. Jesus was nailed to the **Cross** and died and redeemed the world after three hours of suffering.



DEACON

D

A man specially ordained to the service of the Church's ministry. The **deacon** receives the first grade of Holy Orders and helps the priest serve God's people.



DEVIL

A fallen angel or evil spirit who disobeyed God. The **devil** wants us to disobey God by tempting us to sin.



DISCIPLE

One who follows the teaching of Jesus Christ. The Apostles were sometimes called **disciples**.

E

EASTER

The day on which we remember Christ's Resurrection from the dead. On **Easter** we celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death—the greatest of all Christian feasts.



EPIPHANY

The feast on which we remember Christ's making Himself known to the Gentiles in the person of the Magi. **Epiphany** comes from a Greek word meaning "manifestation."



EPISTLE

One of the letters in the New Testament of the Bible written by St. Paul, St. John, St. Peter, St. James, and St. Jude, to the first Christians. The **epistle** is also a Reading at Mass.



EUCCHARIST

The true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, Who is really present under the appearances of bread and wine, in order to offer Himself in the sacrifice of the Mass and to be received as spiritual food in Holy Communion. **Eucharist** means "thanksgiving." When Jesus instituted the **Eucharist** He "gave thanks."





EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The central part of the Mass. During the **Eucharistic Prayer** Jesus becomes present on the altar.



ST. MATTHEW



ST. MARK

EVANGELISTS

The writers of the four Gospels that tell us about the life and teaching of Jesus. The four **Evangelists** are: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.



FAITH



Faith is a gift of God by which the Holy Spirit helps us to accept God's word and to give ourselves to the heavenly Father. We have **faith** in Jesus as the Son of God.



FEAST

A day set apart by the Church for giving special honor to God, the Savior, Angels, Saints, and holy Mysteries and Events of our Lord's life. The greatest **Feast** is Easter.



FORGIVENESS

Pardon or remission of an offense. We receive God's **forgiveness** through the priest in the Sacrament of Penance or of Reconciliation.

GENUFLECTION

G

Bending the knee as an act of reverence to God. We **genuflect** before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.



GLORY

The praise and honor we give to God. In heaven we shall share His **glory**.



GOD

The infinitely perfect spirit Who is the Creator of all. **God** alone must be; all other beings exist only because of Him.



GOOD FRIDAY

Friday in Holy Week, anniversary of Christ's Death on the Cross. On **Good Friday** Catholics fast and abstain from meat.



GOSPEL

The Good News of salvation brought to the world by Jesus. At Mass Jesus teaches us in the **Gospel** reading.



GRACE

Sanctifying grace is a gift of God by which our soul shares in the very life of God. **Actual grace** gives light to our mind and strength to our will.





GUARDIAN ANGEL

The good Angel God gave us to take care of us and to lead us to heaven. We show our love for our **Guardian Angel** by praying to him and listening to him when he tells us to be good.



HAIL MARY



The most important prayer we say to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The **Hail Mary** contains the greeting of the angel Gabriel to Mary, and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary at the Visitation.

HEAVEN

The place where we shall live with God forever if we do good on earth. In **heaven** we shall see God face to face.



HELL

The place of punishment for those who do evil and are never sorry for their sins. **Hell** is the loss of God forever.

GOD IS MY

HOLY

A person who is close to God. God makes us **holy** by His grace.

HOLIDAY

Feast day to be observed by attendance at Mass and rest from unnecessary hard work. There are six **holy-days** of obligation in the United States.



HOLY EUCHARIST

The Sacrament in which Christ Himself, true God and true Man, is really present, offered, and received under the appearances of bread and wine. The **Eucharist** is Mass, Communion, and the Real Presence of Jesus.



HOLY ORDERS

The Sacrament by which Jesus shares the work of His priesthood with the bishops, priests, and deacons of the Church. **Holy Orders** of priests gives power to offer Mass and forgive sins.



HOLY SPIRIT

God, the third Person of the Holy Trinity, equal to the Father and the Son. The **Holy Spirit** makes us holy by giving us His grace.



HOLY WATER

Water blessed by the priest. By using **holy water** we ask for God's protection.





YOUR HEAVENLY FATHER
KNOWS ALL THAT YOU NEED



HOPE

A gift of God which helps us to know that God loves us and cares for us, and that we can trust in Him. We have **hope** in God for the grace we need to reach heaven because of His promises.



HOSANNA

A Hebrew exclamation of joy which means "save us, we pray!" We say or sing **Hosanna** at every Mass.



HOST

The bread that is changed into Christ's Body and Blood at the Consecration at Mass. We receive Jesus when we receive the consecrated **host** in Communion.



HUMAN BEING

Every person on earth who is made up of body and soul. We are **human beings** and God is a Divine Being.



IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

A title of the Blessed Virgin as sinless and full of grace from the first moment of her existence. The feast of the **Immaculate Conception** is on December 8.

INCARNATION

The taking of human nature by God the Son when He was made man by the power of the Holy Spirit at the consent of Mary. The **Incarnation** is the Mystery of God made Man.



INFALLIBILITY

Freedom from error. Christ promised **infallibility** to the Pope and to all the bishops in union with the Pope in a general council, when they teach in matters of faith or morals.



INSPIRATION

The Holy Spirit gave light to the writers of the Bible so that God Himself became the author of the books they wrote. **Inspiration** made them express God's word.



JESUS



The name of our Lord which means "The Lord is salvation." It was given by God to the Son of the Virgin Mary, Who was truly man but truly God as the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. We should always honor the Name of **Jesus**.





JEWS

God's chosen people before the coming of Christ. The **Jews** are also called the Israelites or the Hebrews.



JOSEPH

The husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus. **Joseph** was a carpenter and was known as a just man.



JUDGMENT

The judgment which will be passed on each one of us after death is called the **particular judgment**. At the **last judgment** all of us will stand before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive what we deserve, according to what we have done on earth, good or evil.



JUSTICE

What agrees with God's laws about the rights of God and human beings. We practice **justice** when we give everyone his or her rightful due.



KNEELING



Resting on bent knees as a sign of reverence. We **kneel** when we pray to God and Jesus in the Eucharist.

LAITY



The faithful who are not in Holy Orders and do not belong to a religious state approved by the Church. The **laity** must bear witness to Christ in the world.



LAST SUPPER

The last meal taken by Christ with His Apostles, the night before His Passion. At the **Last Supper** He instituted the Holy Eucharist and the priesthood, and gave the Apostles a long instruction on the Holy Trinity and Christian charity.



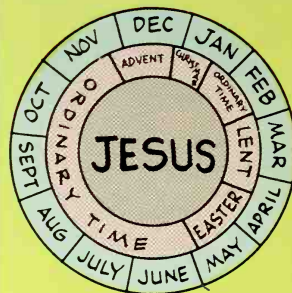
LENT

The season of prayer and penance, forty days from Ash Wednesday to Easter. During **Lent** we prepare for the feast of the Resurrection.



LITURGICAL YEAR

Each year the Church honors the Mysteries of Christ, the Blessed Virgin, Angels, and Saints. The Church reminds us of these Mysteries of the **Liturgical Year** especially in the Mass, the Divine Office, and other devotions.

LORD'S PRAYER

The prayer which Jesus taught us. The **Lord's Prayer** is called the "Our Father," the most important prayer of Christian worship.



GOD NEIGHBOR

LOVE

Love is a gift of God which helps us to love God, and to love all people for the love of God because they too belong to Him. **Love** of God and neighbor is called the Great Commandment.



MAGI

The Wise Men who came from the East to visit the Infant Jesus. The **Magi** adored Jesus and gave Him gifts.



MARTYR

A person who dies rather than give up his or her faith in Jesus. St. Stephen was the first **martyr**.



MARY

We honor the Blessed Virgin Mary by showing her our love and devotion as the Mother of Jesus, and the Mother of the Church, for she is our spiritual Mother. We pray that **Mary**, Mother of God, will ask her Son to help us.

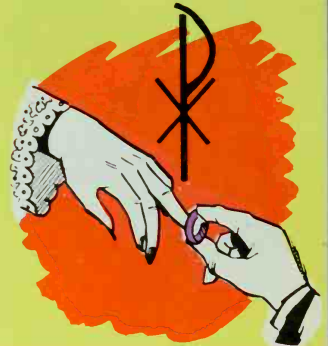
MASS

In the Mass Jesus gives Himself to His heavenly Father, as He did on the cross, but now in an unbloody manner in this Sacrament, for He cannot suffer anymore. The **Mass** is a living Memorial of the Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus Christ, as well as a holy Banquet in which we receive Jesus and offer ourselves to the Father with Him.



MATRIMONY

A Sacrament in which Jesus Christ makes marriage a lifelong, sacred union of husband and wife, by which they give themselves to each other and to him. In **Matrimony** God gives them His grace to do their duties toward each other and their children.



MEDAL

A piece of metal with an image of Jesus, Mary or a Saint on it. A **medal** inspires devotion to God and to the Saints.



MERCY

Showing forgiveness and loving help to others out of love for God. God has **mercy** on all who come to Him in faith and love and sorrow for sin.





HIS IS MY BELOVED SON

MESSIAH

Jesus Christ is the long-awaited Redeemer Who came to deliver us from sin. **Messiah** is a Hebrew word for “Anointed One” foretold by the Prophets.



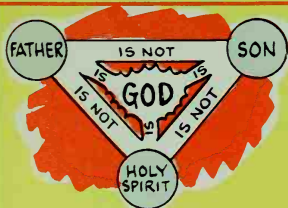
MIRACLE

An event that takes place because God wills it and human beings alone could not do. Jesus worked **miracles** to prove that He was the Son of God.



MISSAL

The book containing the prayers recited by the priest at the altar during Mass. The **Missal** now contains the Sacramentary (prayers of the Mass) and the Lectionary (readings from the Bible used at Mass).



MYSTERY

A religious truth which we believe but cannot understand. **Mystery** also refers to events in the life of Jesus.



NATIVITY

N

Christmas, the birthday of Jesus Christ. The feast of the **Nativity** is celebrated on December 25.

NATURE

All that makes a person what he or she is. Each of us has a human **nature**, but Jesus has two natures—the nature of God and the nature of man, a Divine and a human nature.



NAZARETH

The town where Jesus lived and grew up. **Nazareth** is located in Galilee.



NEIGHBOR

Every person in the world, not only those who live near us. God commanded us to love our **neighbor** as ourselves, and Jesus wants us to love our neighbor as He loved us.



NEW TESTAMENT

The part of the Bible which tells us all that Jesus said and did while He was on earth. The Gospels are found in the **New Testament**, and also the writings of St. Paul, St. Peter, St. James, St. John, St. Jude, and St. Luke.



NUN

A woman who gives her life to serve God and to help people. A **nun** is also called "Sister."





OBEDIENCE



A virtue that helps us to do the will of another who has the right to command. **Obedience** is pleasing to God because it means the sacrifice of our will out of love for God.



OLD TESTAMENT

The part of the Bible that tells us about God and His People before Jesus came. The whole **Old Testament** points to Jesus Christ, Who came to fulfill its prophecies.



ORIGINAL SIN

The sin which all people have who come into the world because of the sin of disobedience of Adam and Eve, our first parents. **Original sin** is the first sin and Baptism takes it away.



OUR LADY

A title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary to show that she is our Queen and our Mother. She is honored by many feasts that begin with the word **Our Lady**.

OUR LORD

A shortened form of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity made Man. **Our Lord** spent the last three years of His life preaching the word of God and preparing the Apostles to continue His work.



P

PALM SUNDAY

Sunday before Easter. On **Palm Sunday** we remember how Jesus came into the city of Jerusalem riding on a donkey while people welcomed Him.



PARABLE

A way of teaching by using a story. Jesus gave us many **parables** such as those of the Prodigal Son, the Good Shepherd, and the Treasure.



PARISH

A part of a diocese with a priest at its head as pastor. Our **parish** takes care of our spiritual needs.



PASSION

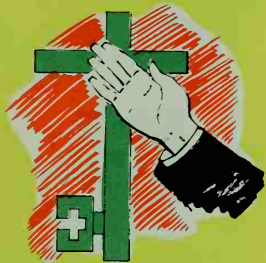
The Suffering and Death of Jesus Christ. The **Passion** shows how much Jesus loved His Father and us—enough to die to save us.





PASTOR

The priest who is in charge of a parish. The **pastor** cares for the spiritual life of his people.



PENANCE

The Sacrament which brings us God's forgiveness for sins committed after Baptism. **Penance** also means what the priest asks us to do after Confession.



PENTECOST

The day on which the Holy Spirit came down on the Apostles. The feast of **Pentecost** comes fifty days after Easter and is called the birthday of the Church.



POPE

The head of the Church who lives in Rome, and takes the place of Jesus on earth. Jesus gave special power in His Church to St. Peter, the first Pope, by making him the head of the Apostles. The **Pope** is the successor of St. Peter.



PRAYER

Turning our thoughts to God and talking with Him. We say **prayers** from a prayerbook or use our own words.

PRIEST

A man who has the power to offer Mass, to forgive sins, to give the other Sacraments, and to teach God's word. The **priest** receives his power from Christ in Holy Orders, and Christ acts through him.



PURGATORY

The place where souls are made completely pure after death before entering heaven. We help the souls in **pur-gatory** by offering Holy Mass and by praying for them.



SOULS ARE PURIFIED

QUEEN



A woman who rules. We call Mary "**Queen** of Heaven" because she is the Mother of our King, Jesus Christ.

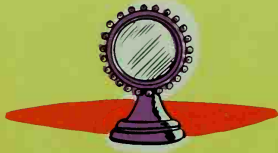


REDEEMER



Jesus is called our Redeemer because He paid our debt for sin and bought heaven back for us by His Suffering and Death, and by His Resurrection from the dead. Since Jesus is our **Re-deemer** we belong entirely to Him and we must love and serve Him.





RELIC

An object connected with a saint, such as a part of the body or clothes. A **relic** is holy.



RELIGIOUS

A man or woman dedicated to the service of God. **Religious** Brothers and Sisters take vows of poverty, chastity, an obedience.



RESURRECTION

By the **Resurrection** of Jesus we mean that He came back to life on Easter, three days after He was buried, to show that He is God and to teach us that we, too, shall rise again. The **resurrection of the body** means that after the Last Judgment those who have done good will rise to live an eternal life with God and will receive the reward of seeing Him in unending joy, and those who have done evil will rise to be punished in hell forever.



REVELATION

What God has made known of Himself and His will to the human race through people whom He enlightened. **Revelation** is contained in the Bible and Tradition (God's Word was passed down through the centuries).

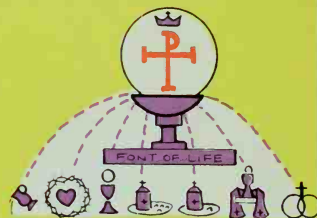
ROSARY

A prayer honoring the Blessed Mother of God. The **Rosary** recalls the important events in the lives of Jesus and Mary.



SACRAMENT

A sign that we can see, made by Christ to give grace. The seven **sacraments** are actions of Christ that make us holy.



SACRAMENTALS

Objects or actions that the Church uses to obtain graces for us. **Sacramentals** include blessings of homes and religious articles.



SACRED HEART

Jesus, God and Man, showing us His Heart as a symbol of His love. June and the first Friday of each month are dedicated to the **Sacred Heart**.



SACRIFICE

An offering to God our Creator to adore, thank, and praise Him and to ask for His forgiveness and help. The greatest **Sacrifice** we can offer to God is Christ Himself in the Mass.





SACRISTY

A room attached to a church, where the clergy vest or where sacred vessels and vestments are kept. We should visit the **sacristy** sometime.



SAINTS

Saints are those who were very close to God on earth and practiced virtue and who are now in heaven. The Church honors the **Saints** because they help us by their prayers and by the good example of their lives.



SCRIPTURE

The Holy Bible is often called Holy Scripture. **Scripture** is God's written word to us, which is the Old and New Testament of the Bible.

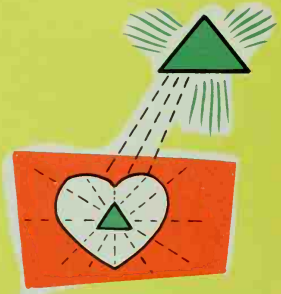


SIN

Mortal sin is a serious offense against the law of God, and it is called mortal because it takes away sanctifying grace, God's life in our soul. **Venial sin** is a less serious offense against the law of God and displeases God, weakens our love for God, and shows that we do not love Him as we should.

SOUL

The soul gives life to the body and will live forever. The **soul** does not die when the body dies, but it goes to God.



SPIRIT

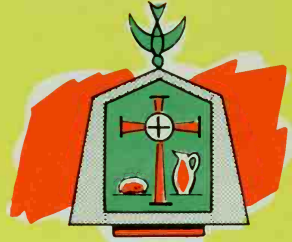
A being with a mind and free will, but no body. An **angel** is a spirit.



TABERNACLE



The place in church where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved. We adore Jesus present in the **tabernacle**.



TEMPLE

The building in which people worshiped God by offering prayers and sacrifices. As a boy Jesus visited the **Temple** in Jerusalem.



TEMPTATION

A strong desire to do something against God's law. God gives us grace to fight **temptation** if we ask for it and avoid places and things that lead us to sin.





TRINITY

The Mystery of the Holy Trinity is the one true God in three Persons—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We should adore the Blessed **Trinity** when we pray to God—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—Who lives in our soul by grace.



"I AM THE WAY, THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE"

TRUTH

Something that is really the way a person says it is. Jesus, by His words and actions, made known the deepest **truths** about God, which are now taught by the Catholic Church.



UNITE



To join together. All who belong to the Church **unite** themselves in worship of the one true God at Mass.



UNIVERSAL

Everywhere in the world and including all people. The Church is Catholic, or **universal**, because it exists for all.



VATICAN



A group of buildings and St. Peter's Basilica around the home of the Pope in Rome. The Pope directs Christ's Church from the **Vatican** State.

VENERATION

The honor given to the Mother of God and the Saints. We give **veneration** to the Saints but adoration to God.



VESTMENTS

Special garments worn by the clergy at the celebration of the Mass and the Sacraments. The use of **vestments** goes back to the garb of the priesthood of Aaron in the Old Testament.



VIRTUE

A good habit that helps a person to act according to the will of God. The greatest **virtue** is love of God and our neighbor.



LOVE THY NEIGHBOR



WORD OF GOD

After speaking through the Prophets, God sent His Son Who told us the "Good New" of salvation. The Bible is God's letter to us, and we should listen carefully to **God's Word** during Holy Mass and read it often.

WORSHIP

We worship God by doing all that He wants us to do; by praying to Him; by offering ourselves to Him through Jesus in the Mass. We **worship** God especially in Holy Mass because in Holy Mass Jesus offers Himself to His Father, as He did on the Cross. He gives God the highest honor.

XAVIER

The last name of a great Saint in the Church. Saint Francis **Xavier** is known as the “Apostle of the Indies.”



Y

YEAR

A period of twelve months. The Church **Year** begins with the Season of Advent when we prepare for the coming of Jesus.



Z

ZEAL

Strong desire to obtain a goal. The virtue of **zeal** helps us to spread God’s Kingdom on earth.

Dear parents:

The direct authority over the child God delegates to the parents. He asks you, mother and father, to care for the child's physical development as he would care for it; to give the child the love that he would give to any product of His creation; to set before the child, as His reasoning powers awaken, His own Divine purpose and plan for that child; to instruct and train and discipline the growing child in all the obligations and means that He has made known as necessary for the attainment of His goals in life.

The first or primary goal of child-bearing is eternal happiness. Every human being born into the world is to know, love, and serve God in this world to gain the happiness of heaven. This is the very heart of the responsibility that God imposes on you as parents when He makes a child dependent on your authority, your guidance, your inspiration and instruction for many years of its life.

The teaching of the Catholic Church is your surest guide in teaching your child the way to eternal happiness in heaven. This little Dictionary contains most of the important elements of the Catholic catechism. It will be useful to your child only if you help your child to understand the meaning of the words most often used in Catholic doctrine. It is another way of teaching your child the catechism of the Church. It is a very helpful companion for religious instruction. I recommend to you many other booklets which I have written to help your children know, love, and serve God and reach eternal happiness in heaven.
