



Ceremonial for Profession

In the Third Order of Penance of Saint Dominic



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The priest, dressed in the Cappa and white stole (or surplice and stole, if he be a secular priest), goes to the altar with a server carrying a candle and holy water. Two candles should be lighted on the altar. The novice(s) kneel, and the priest asks:

Priest: What do you seek?

Novice: God's mercy and yours.

Now the priest may, if he wishes, give a short exhortation on the excellence or the duties of the Third Order;

The priest gives the novice a lighted candle. Then, kneeling on the last step of the altar, he intones the Veni Creator; he rises (together with everyone else) after the first stanza. The chant may be sung by alternating choirs.

Thou, finger of God's hand we own;
The promise of the Father, Thou
Who dost the tongue with power imbue.

Kindle our senses from above,
and make our hearts o'erflow with love;
with patience firm and virtue high
the weakness of our flesh supply.

Far from us drive the foe we dread
and grant to us Thy peace instead;

The novice, on his knees and holding the lit candle in one hand and the book of the Rule in the other, pronounces distinctly the formula of his profession:

To the honour of Almighty God, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, and of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of Saint Dominic, I, Brother (Sister) ___, in your presence, Father ___, profess and declare that I wish henceforth to live according to the constitutions and

Grant, we beseech Thee, almighty God, that thy servant(s) who is (are) weighed down by the burden of (his) sins may, being about to profess this rule of penance, be lifted up by the patronage of blessed Dominic, our Father, thy Confessor.

Grant, we beseech Thee, almighty God, that the example of the Saints of our Order may help and inspire this thy servant (handmaid) to a better life, so that (he) who is about to profess their rule of penance may be able to fulfil it by their merits and intercession.

Stretch forth, O Lord, to thy servant(s) the right hand of heavenly assistance, so that (he) may seek Thee with his whole heart and obtain what (he) worthily asks for, through Christ, our Lord.

R. Amen.

way of life of the Brothers and Sisters of the Order of Penance of Saint Dominic, until death.

Afterwards, the priest gives the newly professed the kiss of peace (for Sisters, he gives them the hem of his scapular or stole to kiss); then, turning towards the Altar, he intones the Te Deum, which is sung or recited by alternating choirs.

throughout his novitiate, that
persevering in Thy service he may
grow in Thy love.

For both :

O God, who dost prepare mansions
in heaven for those who forsake the
world, dilate the heart of Thy
servant with heavenly blessings,
that, by the intercession of blessed
Dominic, our Father, his life may so
agree with the name of penance that
his profession may always be
manifest in his works. Through

Christ, our Lord. R. Amen.

The priest then sprinkles the novice(s) and newly professed with holy water, saying:

Benedictio Dei omnipotentis, Patris, et Filii, et Spiritus Sancti descendat
super te et maneat semper.

R. Amen.

Finally, after giving the novices some further words of encouragement, if he wishes, he turns towards the altar and says:

V. Adjutorium nostrum in nomine Domini. V. Our help is in the name of the Lord.

R. Qui fecit caelum et terram. R. Who made heaven and earth.

The names of the newly professed, together with the names given them in the Order, as well as the place and date of Profession, should be entered in a book destined for this purpose, and a certificate of Profession should be given to the newly-professed.

Ad libitum, after the ceremony: (two antiphons from the Liturgy of the Friars Preachers).
